



# Apply First Aid

## Career Opportunities

For many industries Apply First Aid is mandatory entry requirements. This qualification provides the skills and knowledge required to provide first aid response, life support, management of casualty(s), the incident and other first aiders, until the arrival of medical or other assistance.

## Pathways to Further Studies

By successfully completing Apply First Aid you can apply for employment where it is necessary to perform the duties of a workplace-based first-aid attendant. You may wish to undertake Certificate III/IV level study in other areas of Community and Health Services qualifications, where this unit may be applied as a Credit Transfer.

## Entry Requirements

There are no prerequisite units for this qualification. There are no prerequisite units for this course. A range of skills are recommended in reading and speaking that would enable an individual to:

Read and interpret signs, instructions and procedures, and Communicate clearly with a range of individuals and as part of a team.

## Course Cost and Duration

These programs are bundled together and are delivered over a period of 12 hours over two days.

## Delivery Method

The delivery of this program will be conducted within a group classroom setting. Training manuals and workbooks are supplied which include all materials used in the training sessions and all reference and assessment materials.





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## Assessment Method

Assessment will be undertaken in accordance with the relevant applicable legislation. Students will be provided with comprehensive learner guides. Your knowledge and skills will be assessed using a combination of methods such as problem solving, role plays and observations of practical demonstrations in a class-room setting as appropriate to the element of competency and (ii) assignments/written questions incorporated in a workbook, and (iii) a multi-choice test.

The training/assessment material utilised for this course are purchased from 'Survival Emergency Products' (ref. [www.survival.net.au](http://www.survival.net.au)). At enrolment, participants are provided with the following documents produced by Survival:

- (i) First Aid Emergency handbook
- (ii) Basic Emergency Life Support handbook
- (iii) CPR Emergency handbook
- (iv) Workbook

In addition, participants are provided with one roll bandage and a triangular bandage. Participants also have access to suitable equipment for practice/demonstration purposes which includes both adult & baby CPR mannequins. Trainers are provided with all of the above learning material in addition to the 'Sample Responses for Trainers Workbook' produced by 'Survival Emergency Products'.

Upon successful completion of this course you will obtain nationally recognized statements of attainment for:

- HLTCPR201A Perform CPR, and
- HLTF201A Provide basic emergency life support
