

Wage Subsidies



Funded by the Australian Government, wage subsidies provide a financial incentive to employers to help cover the costs of training, development and may assist in overcoming loss of productivity in the first few months of employment.

Wage Subsidy Criteria and Eligibility

Your CVGT consultant will be able to inform you if you are eligible for this assistance. The amount of the Wage Subsidy will be tailored to the job seeker and to your business. In addition, the job seeker needs to have been identified as eligible for the Wage Subsidy by a CVGT consultant.

The Wage Subsidy is paid after the job seeker has been employed for 13 and 26 consecutive weeks for the agreed number of hours as detailed in your agreement with CVGT.

Employer role

If you are eligible, you must agree that the employment arrangement will continue for the period required by the relevant wage subsidy criteria. It should also be your intention to provide ongoing employment to the job seeker after the completion of the wage subsidy period. As an employer, you are also required to pay all wages and meet all other entitlements for your employee as required by state or federal law. Including superannuation, insurance, occupational health and safety and taxation. Please refer to the Employment Agreement for full terms and conditions.
