What is a wage subsidy?

A wage subsidy is a financial incentive of up to **\$10,000*** to encourage businesses to hire and train eligible job seekers. For a business to receive a wage subsidy, the job seeker must have been registered with CVGT Australia for six months or more.

Is my business eligible?

Your business is eligible for a wage subsidy if you:



Have an ABN



Haven't already received a wage subsidy for the same job seeker



Are not an Australian, state or territory government agency

What type of jobs can I offer?



- ✓ Ongoing full-time jobs
- ✓ Ongoing part-time jobs
- ✓ Complies with Australian employment standards
- ✓ Apprenticeships or traineeships
- ✓ Minimum 20 hours each week for six months



- ✗ Short-term or seasonal work that will not lead to ongoing employment
- ✗ For a family member
- ✗ Sub-contracting or self-employment
- ✗ A job that displaces a current employee
- ✗ Commission based

Who can I hire?

To receive a wage subsidy, the job seeker you employ must be registered with CVGT Australia. Other eligibility requirements are based on a job seeker's circumstances.

How do I apply?

To apply for a wage subsidy contact your local CVGT Australia.

Wage subsidy summary



Restart Wage Subsidy

Up to \$10,000 for employing eligible job seekers aged 50 or older



Youth Bonus Wage Subsidy

Up to \$10,000 for employing eligible job seekers aged between 15 and 24 years.



Youth Wage Subsidy

Up to \$6,500 to businesses who employ eligible job seekers aged between 25 and 29 years.



Indigenous Wage Subsidy

Up to \$6,500 for employing eligible Indigenous job seekers.



Long Term Unemployed Wage Subsidy

Up to \$6,500 for employing job seekers registered with CVGT Australia for 12 months or more.



Parents Wage Subsidy

Up to \$6,500 for employing job seekers who are principal carer parents.
